2018 MASS BOOK

The Mass Book for 2018 opened on Wednesday, March 1, 2017. There are some changes this year, and we ask for your patience, understanding, and cooperation. Due to the fact that after our merger we lost 300+ Masses per year and our Mass book filled very quickly, we are limiting the number of Masses you may purchase per household. Each household will only be allowed to reserve 2 weekend Masses and 3 weekday Masses when the book opens. You MUST reserve in person from March 1 – March 17, 2017.

If Masses are available after August 1, 2017, each household may reserve 2 more weekend and 3 more weekday Masses. We would like to keep this policy to allow as many people as possible to reserve Masses and not sell out a year ahead of time. We ask that you also consider the options of our Memorial Book and sanctuary candles in lieu of a Mass. Thank you for your cooperation.

CEMETERY DECORATIONS

ALL holiday decorations at the cemetery must be removed by **March 31st** for spring clean-up. Please feel free to place items in the dumpster/dump truck by the sheds. Thank you for your cooperation.

CEMETERY VIOLATIONS

All cemetery violations must be rectified by May 1, 2017. Please read through the following to see if you are in violation. Thank you for your support.

DECORATIONS:

1. The planting of shrubs, rosebushes, or trees of any kind is forbidden. Any pre-existing shrubs will be removed when they exceed the height to the monument, encroach on an adjoining plot, or appear unsightly, and may not be replaced.

2. Any decorations which become unsightly will be removed and discarded without notice.

3. Flower beds of real or artificial flowers: a) may not extend any more than 12 inches out from the monument base b) may be no wider than the monument base c) may not be more than 18" high. This 12-inch area shall also include decorative edging. If the flower bed and/or decorative edging becomes unsightly, they (it) will be removed. Also, any portion of flower beds, artificial flowers, and/or edging extending out more than 12 inches from the monument base will be removed.

4. Artificial flowers may be used (subject to Section E., subs. 1,2,3,4 & 5). Christmas decorations not already disposed of will be removed by March 31st.

5. Floral arrangements, including artificial flowers, if mounted on the top of a monument, must be fastened with the use of a tack. Wreaths, if mounted on the face of a monument, must be tied to the monument with string. The use of tape of any kind is not allowed. Wreaths, if mounted on the ground in front of a monument, must be secured with tack or string and must be within 12 inches from the base. Flower blankets extending out more than 12 inches from the base of the monument are prohibited.

6. The use of glass pots and/or flower boxes is forbidden.

7. The placement of vigil lights is not allowed.

F. Ornamental flags may be installed. The flag holders are the responsibility of the installing organization. All flags will be removed by December 1st, or earlier if faded or damaged.

G. The cemetery is strictly closed to all unrelated and/or inappropriate activities. This includes sporting activities, dog walking, and any other activity which detracts from the serenity and sacred nature of the cemetery.
