2018 MASS BOOK

The Mass Book for 2018 opened on **Wednesday, March 1, 2017**. There are some changes this year, and we ask for your patience, understanding, and cooperation. Due to the fact that after our merger we lost 300+ Masses per year and our Mass book filled very quickly, we are limiting the number of Masses you may purchase per household. Each household will only be allowed to reserve **2 weekend Masses and 3 weekday Masses when the book opens**. If Masses are available after August 1, 2017, each household may reserve 2 more weekend and 3 more weekday Masses. We would like to keep this policy to allow as many people as possible to reserve Masses and not sell out a year ahead of time. We ask that you also consider the options of our Memorial Book and sanctuary candles in lieu of a Mass. Thank you for your cooperation.

The completion of the Trinity Dome, in preparation for the one hundredth anniversary of the placing of the foundation stone of the National Shrine in 2020, is a monumental undertaking for which the bishops of the United States have approved a special one-time collection to take place on this Mother's Day.

The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception is the patronal church of our nation, dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary under her title of the Immaculate Conception. This great Marian shrine exists today because of the generosity of American Catholics, the prayers of the faithful, and the hard work of the artisans and laborers who began building it nearly one hundred years ago.
